1. Definitions

2. About this privacy statement

This Privacy Policy applies to all persons who interact with us (you/your), including everyone who visits or uses our Website. This Privacy Policy applies to our collection and use of your personal information. By visiting and/or using our Website and/or dealing with us, you agree to the terms and conditions of this Privacy Policy.

We will manage your personal information in an open and transparent way. We have commercially acceptable internal processes and controls in place to store your personal information securely in our various systems across our network.

The Trustee For The Audi Foundation is committed to user privacy and guards your data carefully. The online environment provides an unprecedented access to information, but the convergence of communication and information technologies also brings a range of information privacy issues to the centre of public concern.

At The Trustee For The Audi Foundation, we take care to respect your right to privacy and to fully comply with our obligations under the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). The Trustee For The Audi Foundation can only obtain personal information from you via this site if you choose to supply it to us by entering your information in the appropriate locations herein.

3. Your consent

By using our Website, you consent to the collection and use of your personal information by The Trustee For The Audi Foundation as described below. If we decide to change our Privacy Policy, we will post those changes on this page so that you are always aware of what information we collect, how we use it, and under what circumstances we disclose it. 4. Personal information collected

The types of personal information that we collect and hold will depend on how you use the www.audifoundation.com.au web site.

We collect and hold personal information, such as your name, e-mail address, phone number, postal code, age and gender. Some of this information is essential for us to be able to accurately identify who is using the service. If you do not provide this information to us we will not be able to provide the additional information you may have requested.

We do NOT actively collect or hold, nor do we need to know any sensitive (personal) information (such as personal information about your racial or ethnic origin, health information, political opinions, membership of a political association, professional or trade association or trade union, religious beliefs or affiliations, philosophical beliefs, sexual orientation or practices, criminal record, genetic information, biometric information or biometric templates).

We ask that you do NOT send us or disclose to us any of your sensitive information. If you do however, you consent to us collecting and holding that sensitive information in accordance with this Privacy Policy.

For statistical purposes, we collect de-identified information on web site activity (such as the number of users who visit the web site from another site, the address of that site) through the use of "cookies".

5. Cookies

"Cookies" are small pieces of information that are stored by your browser on your computer's hard drive. Our cookies only contain de-identified information, but they do enable us to provide features such as storing items of interest to users of our Website between visits. Most web browsers automatically accept cookies, but you can usually change your browser to prevent that.

Cookies help us provide a better user experience by measuring which Website areas are of greatest interest to visitors of our Website. If you choose to disable cookies in your browser, you can still access most of our Website. Some Websites will not allow you to complete certain activities if cookies are disabled.

From time to time, The Trustee For The Audi Foundation may provide aggregated statistical information about browsing patterns and navigation techniques to reputable third parties. This is de-identified information, and assists The Trustee For The Audi Foundation to improve its website and the information within..

6. Use and disclosure of personal information.

Your personal information may be used and disclosed by us in order to:

- provide you with information and updates in connection with the Audi Foundation's charitable activities and initiatives;
- comply with our legal obligations

Our contracted parties are not authorised by us to use personal information for anything other than the purpose for which we supplied that information to them. Some of our information technology service providers may be located overseas and, as a result, personal information collected and held by The Trustee For The Audi Foundation may be transferred overseas.

Sometimes, the law requires us to disclose personal information. For example, information may be disclosed to a court in response to a subpoena or to a Government agency such as a vehicle licensing authority or the Australian Taxation Office.

We may also disclose personal information where you consent to us doing so. That consent may be written, verbal or implied from your conduct.

7. Security of your personal information

In accordance with its Public Privacy Policy, The Trustee For The Audi Foundation has implemented strict procedures and systems designed to protect the security of your personal information. The Trustee For The Audi Foundation honours your choice for its intended use. Our aim is to carefully protect your data from misuse, interference, loss, unauthorised access, modification or disclosure, alteration or destruction.

Unfortunately, no data transmission over the Internet can be guaranteed to be 100% secure. Whilst we strive to protect your personal information from misuse, loss and unauthorised access, we cannot guarantee the security of any information you transmit to us. You conduct these activities at your own risk. Once we receive your transmission, we make our best effort to ensure its security.

8. Links to other sites

The Trustee For The Audi Foundation provides access to other sites by way of hyperlinks from this web site. These other sites are not subject to the Trustee For The Audi Foundation's privacy standards and procedures. You should make your own enquiries as to the privacy standards for each linked site.

9. Accessing and updating information

We will take reasonable steps to ensure that all information we collect, use or disclose is accurate, up to date and complete.

We need your help in making sure your personal information is correct on our systems. Please e-mail us if you want to access your personal information or seek the correction of such information including to notify us of any changes to your name, address, title, phone number, e-mail address or postal code. You have rights to access your personal information held by us subject to the provisions of the Privacy Act 1988 (Cth). If we refuse to provide you with access to your personal information, we will provide you with reasons for the refusal.

We will provide the requested personal information in a reasonable time. We will take reasonable steps to correct any of your personal information that you can establish is not accurate, complete, up-to-date or relevant.
